Old Sacramento Public Docks Rules and Regulations Chapter 12.104

The Old Sacramento Public Docks are owned and operated by the City of Sacramento. For the safety of others, people are expected to follow the regulations that apply to the Old Sacramento Public Docks. The City asks that all persons at the docks be courtesy and respectful to others.

- 1. Hours of operations and payment requirements are posted on the dock.
- 2. All vessels must be currently registered.
- 3. The owner or operator of a vessel shall provide proof of registration upon request.
- 4. All children 15 years or younger must be accompanied by the child's parent, legal guardian, or responsible adult.
- 5. All animals must be leashed or properly restrained while upon the docks.
- 6. No raft-ups/tie-ups allowed.
- 7. No vending or commercial activity on the docks is allowed unless permission has been granted by the City of Sacramento.
- 8. No roller-skating, skateboarding, bicycles, or scooters.
- 9. No fishing.
- 10. No one may place, deposit, or throw refuse, debris, or trash onto the docks or into the Sacramento River. Use of open-flame devices is not allowed.
- 11. Loading and unloading of passengers for hire is not allowed unless the operator of the vessel has obtained permission from the City through an agreement, lease, license, or permit.
- 12. Do not willfully break, remove, or tamper with any part of a vessel moored at the docks.
- 13. Do not enter or climb upon a vessel without the consent of the vessel owner.
- 14. Do not deface, damage, destroy, or remove any sign or other property located upon the docks.
- **15.** In the event of an accident, please contact City 311 by dialing 311 or (916) 808-5011and obtain a City of Sacramento accident report that must be completed and returned to the City.
