1. Riverboat Delta King, 1000 Front Street

Location Clue #1: We are just getting started, to find the first leprechaun head to the embarcadero and find the biggest floating ship. Can you see him from above?

4. O'Mally's- Frey Building, 1109 2nd Street

Location Clue #4: No time to stop now! Let's go to the nearest Irish pub. Its name starts with an O. If you stand across the entrance and look right up, you will get a great view from above. If you see him, complete the phrase below!

Word Clue #4: Mr. Leprechaun wants you to know that this structure was first owned by an Irishman named John Haley. His legacy made sure this building would remain a saloon and bar for over 100 years. This is why to this day it remains adorned with the Irish's iconic four-leaf ______. 7. Pacific Union Train Caboose, 1849 Scene

Founded in 1862 as President Abraham Lincoln signed the Pacific Railway Act. There was a labor shortage in the Central Pacific sector but after hiring Chinese workers to build the railroad, their work was considered ______ effective and this lead to a fast-moving process in the construction.
